## Morning Tours

Visit the following projects  
from 9:30 am to 11:30 am

### Soil Born Farms Amphitheater

*designed by Lionakis*

**Location:** American River Ranch, 2140 Chase Drive, Rancho Cordova

An urban teaching farm with an open-air amphitheatre carved into the land.

### ABC School for Autistic Children

*designed by Monighandesign*

**Location:** 4540 Harlin Drive, Sacramento

Constructed from hand-plastered straw bales to create a humanized, rich, tactile experience.

### Hook and Ladder Restaurant & Bar

*designed by Hausman Architecture*

**Location:** 1630 S St., Sacramento

Mid-town restaurant serving locally grown products in a repurposed Quonset hut steeped in local history. Tour and stay for lunch!

### Globe Mills

*designed by Applied Architecture, Inc., Mike Malinowski, AIA*

Tour + Optional Bonus "Ghost Spaces Adventure"

**Location:** 1131 C Street, Sacramento

A housing complex centered around grain silos which were once one of the largest working mills west of the Mississippi.

## Afternoon Tours Continued

### Davis Food Coop

*designed by Maria Ogrydziak, AIA*

**Location:** 620 G Street, Davis

An AIACC Honor Award winner, this grocery store is anything but ordinary. The bright green building and yellow CO-OP sign pay homage to Central Valley colors while the angled covered entry, outdoor eating patio, and prominent art pedestals create inviting spots to linger and chat about local produce or the latest farm to fork project.

### UC Agricultural and Natural Resources Building

*designed by MFDB Architects*

**Location:** 2801 Second Street, Davis

This 33,000 sq ft repurposed steel building warehouse reminiscent of an agriculture building and the region, will serve as a conference and meeting space for the entire University of California system.

### Sacramento Water Intake Structure

*designed by Lionakis*

**Location:** 200 Jibboom St., Sacramento

Sacramento River Water Facility is located on the 500 Block of Jibboom Street, next to the Robert Matsui Waterfront Park.

This beautiful water intake structure pumps 160 million gallons-per-day. It has an accessible plaza with bicycle paths and provides an unobstructed view of the river.
