Bottle & Barlow would mix nightspot with barbershop on R Street

Another nightspot is being proposed for the busy R Street corridor in downtown Sacramento -- one you could call a bar-ber shop.

Bottle & Barlow, which would occupy the first floor of the <u>Warehouse Artist Lofts</u> at 12th & R streets, would have drinks being mixed on one side and hairstyles updated on the other, separated by a glass wall for cleanliness purposes.

According to a business application for a conditional-use permit received by the city, Bottle & Barlow would occupy a 3,428-square-foot space and be divided into fourths, with the bar and barbershop each taking a quarter and common spaces occupying the rest.

The project application states the barbershop would be open from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m., while the bar would be open from 3 p.m. to 2 a.m. In addition to inside seating, the business would have outdoor patio seating with heat lamps, according to the narrative.

Though the application says there would be no need for a kitchen, a site plan does show a food preparation area next to the bar.

<u>Kimio Bazett</u>, co-owner of Hook & Ladder and <u>The Golden Bear</u> in midtown Sacramento, is listed as the applicant for Bottles & Barlow. Bazett said he had no comment on the project for now, citing the pending <u>city</u> of <u>Sacramento</u> review.

Warehouse Artist Lofts, a <u>CFY Development</u> project, is under construction now and set to open this fall. <u>D&S Development</u> is working on rehab of the neighboring Rochdale building, which will also have a retail use in the form of an Italian restaurant.


